DISCUSSION GUIDE

In the second sermon on Godly Vision, we are reminded that Nehemiah persisted and persevered. Because the burden he had for the rebuilding of the wall of Jerusalem came from God, no matter what came his way, the vision was realized. Not only did the wall get rebuilt, but the people praised God for it. Taking responsibilities for our lives, making the most of them as God desires, and advancing the church and the kingdom of God requires a vision from God. A Godly vision is a burden that brings glory to God. Pastor Neal shared an acrostic for VISION:

Visualize
Internalize
Strategize
Implement
Overcome
Necessity

7. Read Nehemiah 6:15-16. How long did it take to build the wall? And who gets credit for it?
8. What's your biggest take away from Sunday's message and today's discussion?
