Key Scripture: Ruth 3:1-9

DISCUSSION GUIDE

Have you ever been told that Christians are narrow minded? For instance, is Jesus the only way? Can't all roads lead to heaven? This week, we'll discuss the Biblical response to these questions. We learn about a family redeemer –why we need one and what the requirements are for being a family redeemer. Boaz was the family redeemer for Ruth. And we will make the connection that Jesus is a better Boaz as our ultimate family redeemer. Jesus is the only one qualified, willing and able.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. Think back to Sunday's message. What do you remember? Review your notes if you have them. If you're with a CV group, talk with them about anything you found memorable or confusing.
2. What are the requirements of a family redeemer according to the following passages? Leviticus 25:25; Leviticus 25:47-49; Deuteronomy 25:5-10
3. We are told that Boaz is a family redeemer – How do Boaz's actions reflect Jesus' work of redemption?
4. Read Hebrews 2:14-15. What accomplishments are listed here that tell us Jesus is qualified?
5. Read Philippians 2:5-7 and John 10:18. How do we know Jesus was willing?
6. Read Hebrews 9:12-15. What does this passage tell us about Jesus being able to be our family redeemer?
7. Is there any way to salvation / redemption other than by faith in Jesus Christ? Why do you believe this way? Why don't (a) self-effort, or (b) other religions offer a true path to salvation? How does Acts 4:12 speak to these questions?
8. When did you recognize your need for a Redeemer/Savior? How is faith in Jesus Christ for redemption more than intellectual agreement with certain doctrinal or historical facts? More than trusting Him only for temporal needs?
9. What's one thing you learned from Sunday's message and today's discussion that will help you become a better disciple of Christ, and help others do the same?
